## Preventing Substance Use and Opioid Overdoses in Youth

- **Opioid-related overdose is a national public health crisis.** Overdoses and deaths caused by illicit fentanyl are increasing among youth.
- **What is MCPS doing?** MCPS works with the Montgomery Goes Purple community coalition to coordinate prevention and support around substance use by:
  - Increasing awareness of and access to the emergency overdose medication naloxone (Narcan)
  - Connecting schools with youth supports and programs
  - Offering resources so families are empowered to address substance use with youth and act if they are concerned

# What is Montgomery Virtual Academy (MVA)

MVA is not a school it is a MCPS Choice Program

- Student is still enrolled in their home school
- Student is allowed to fully participate in extracurricular activities in the home school
- Student can attend accelerated and honors courses not offered in the home school.

Enrollment is capped at 2000 students (upper/lower) schools

- Eligibility is based upon students programming/scheduling requirements
- Waitlist based upon capacity and programming

# What is Dual Enrollment?

- Dual Enrollment is a college initiative that allows qualified high school students to be admitted and enrolled in college. Students take approved college courses and earn both high school and college credit. DE is not a high school program, it is a college program for high school students.
- MCPS has partnered with MC to provide specific Dual Enrollment options specifically for MCPS students. Beginning in FY2024, dual enrollment courses at MC will be **FREE**.

# Dual Enrollment Timeframe

## Degree Application

- **Every Fall-** Grade 8 for most and Grade 10 for Early College only.
- Preparation and planning must begin early.

## Course Enrollment

- **October – January:** enrollment for spring term
- **March – June:** Enrollment for summer I & II terms
- **April – August:** Enrollment for fall term
- Student must be enrolled before class begins: no late registration is allowed

# A Few Additional Dual Enrollment Expectations

- Students **must earn grades of “C” or higher in their college classes in order to maintain eligibility to remain in the program.** Grades of “C” or better are crucial as this may affect transferability of credits, students' ability to receive future federal financial aid and satisfying prerequisites for future college classes.
- Students must also perform and behave according to college standards.
- Operate as a college student. Students must have the knowledge to be successful and the maturity and confidence to self-advocate.

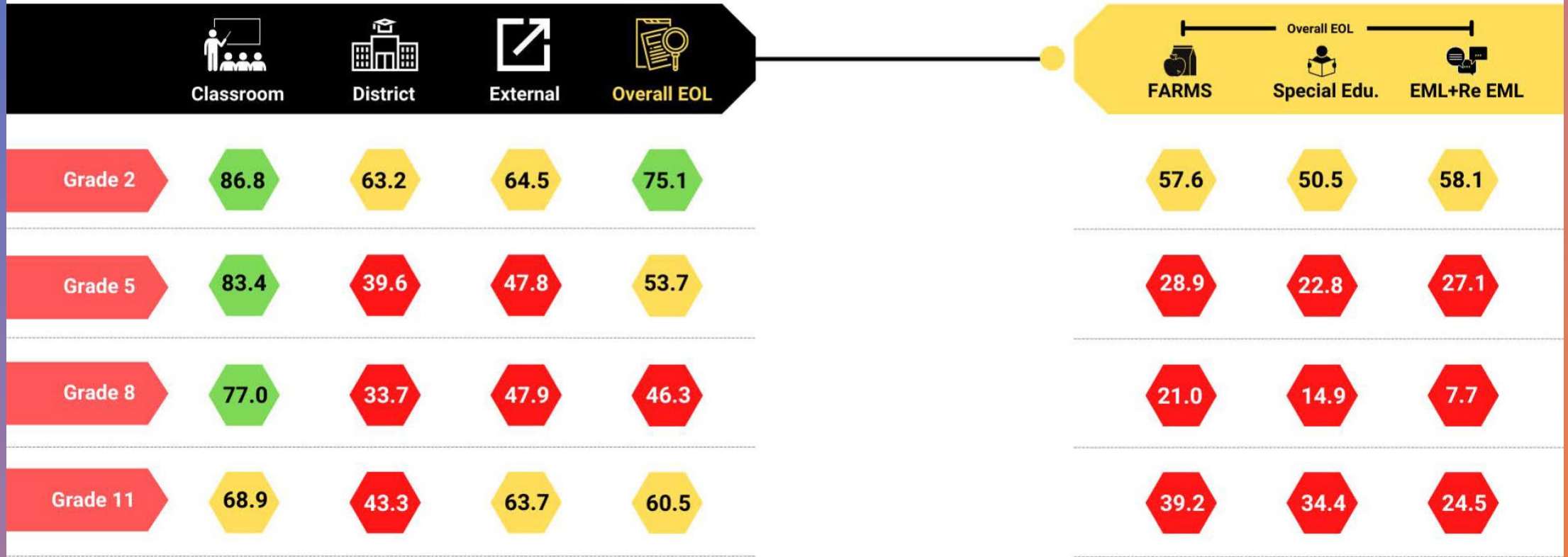

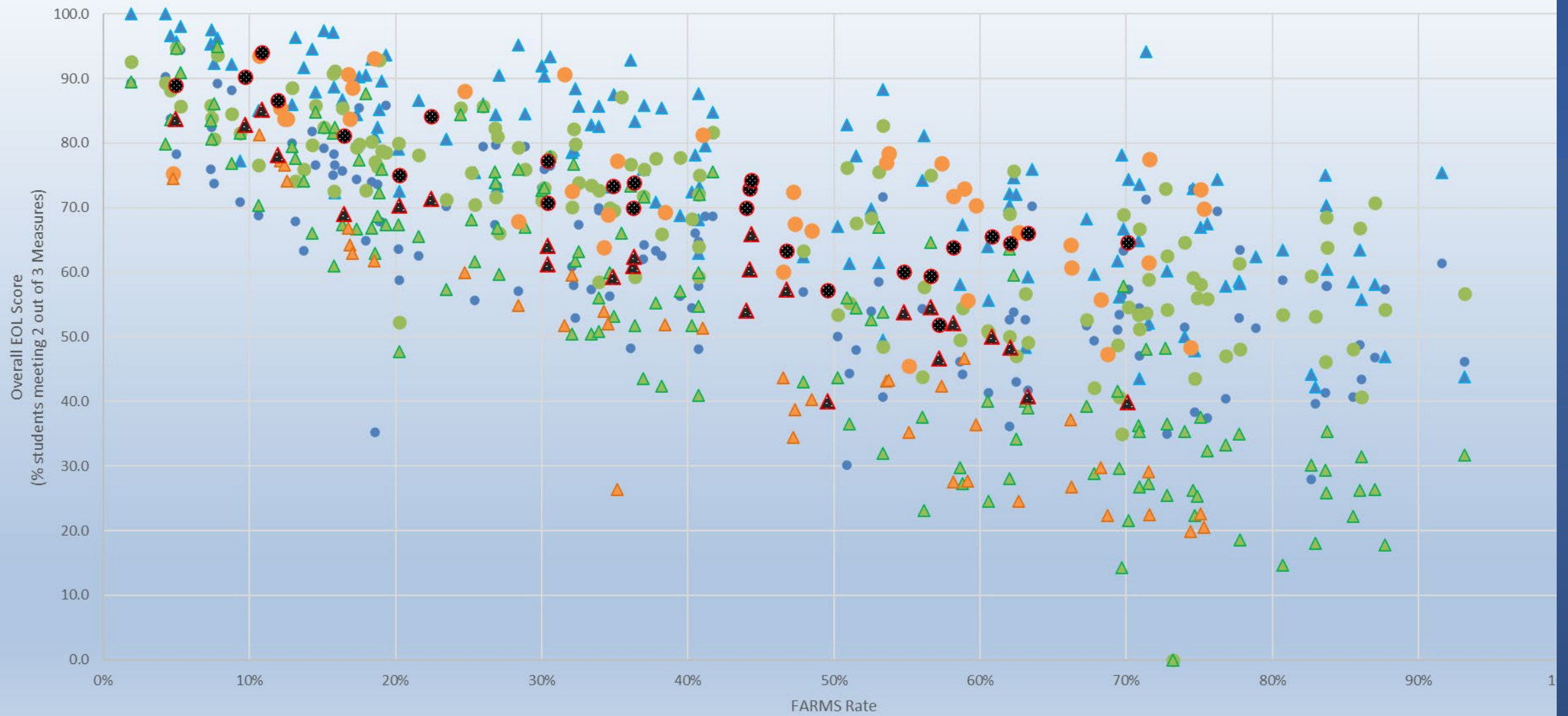

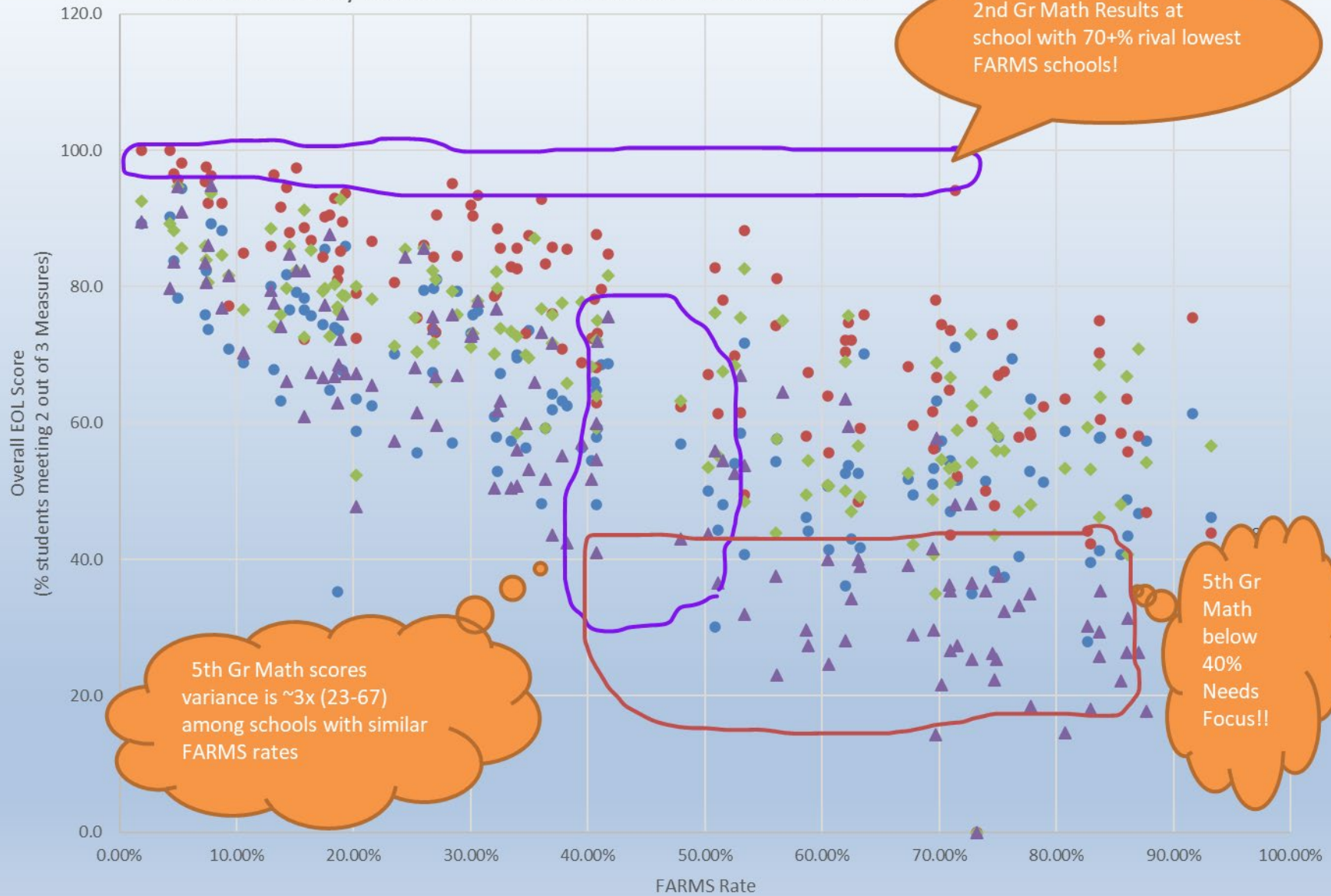
2022 EOL Scores vs FARMS Rate by School

### 2022 Elementary School 2nd & 5th Grade EOL vs FARMS Rate



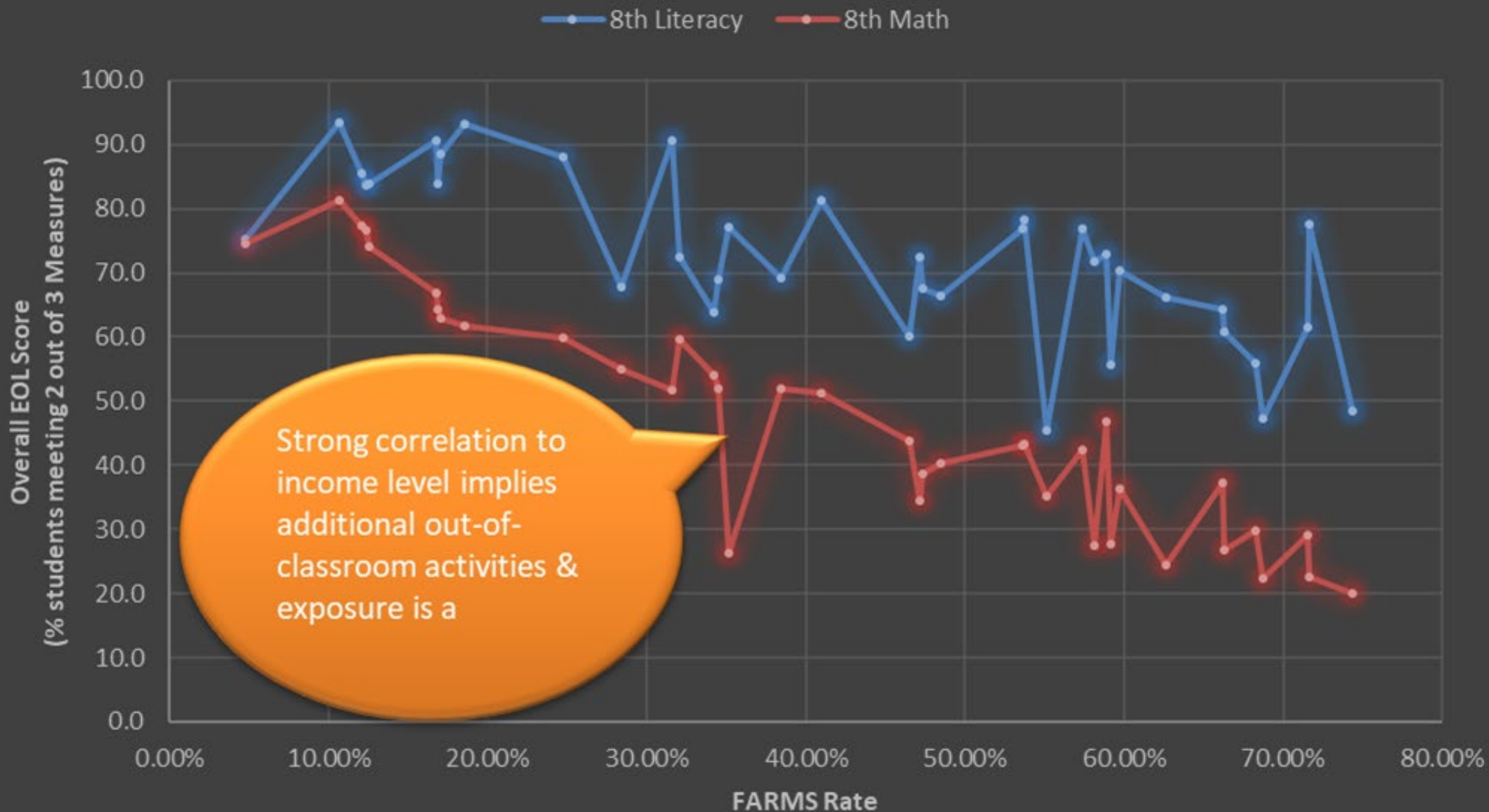

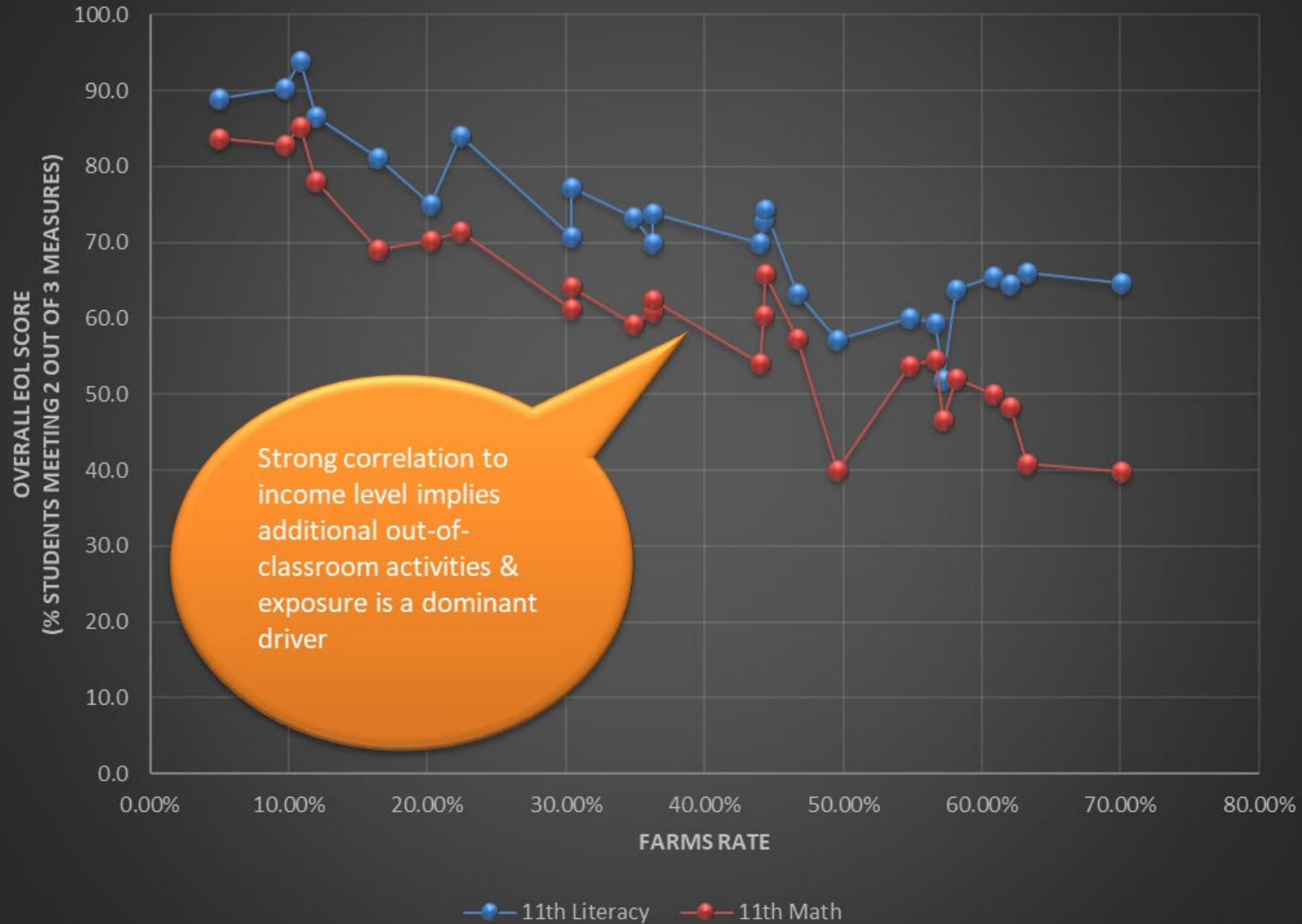

## “Need to Know” (Semester 2)

**Purpose:** To highlight critical items that parents need to be aware of in order to support their children.
